


# Comma After a Fronted Adverbial

1. Choose one of the images above, then cut it out and stick it into your book.
2. Using the headers How, Where, When, How often, Possibility and Order, create a mind map of sentences that start with adverbial phrases.

Example:

**When**

As the sun went down, the duck moved serenely across the calm surface of the pond

**How**

Rapidly, the duck's webbed feet paddled beneath the surface of the pond.

**Where**

Beneath the overhanging branches of an ancient oak tree, the duck bobbed up and down on the surface of the pond.

**Order**

Firstly, the duck majestically swam to the end of the pond to find more food.

**How often**

Every day, people of all ages come to feed the famished duck their leftover breadcrumbs.

**Possibility**

Almost certainly, the duck will find all the food it needs in the pond.
